#### **NEW AND NOTEWORTHY**

- Summer 2025 data submission window: July 1 August 15, 2025
  - The data submission deadline will not be extended
    - All data must be submitted by August 15
    - Communicate any extenuating circumstances to your Federal
       Project Officer as soon as you know about them
  - Grants awarded in fall 2024 will submit data for the first time
  - Users with more than one active SRAE grant should confirm you have portal access for all your grants before entering data


### SRAE PERFORMANCE MEASURES

#### THREE CATEGORIES OF SRAE PERFORMANCE MEASURES

- 1. Structure, cost, and support for program implementation
- 2. Attendance, reach, and dosage
- 3. Participant characteristics, program experiences, and perceptions of program effects



### LEVELS OF SRAE PERFORMANCE MEASURES DATA





#### **KEY DEFINITIONS**

- Grant recipients receive SRAE funding directly from FYSB
- Providers implement SRAE programming directly with youth
  - Some providers are SRAE grant recipients
  - Others are subrecipients that receive funding from an SRAE grant recipient
- Program models consist of core curriculum plus other lessons or activities integrated to meet SRAE objectives
- Cohorts are groups of youth jointly receiving a defined SRAE program
  - A cohort could consist of an individual, if programming is delivered one-onone



GRANT RECIPIENT-LEVEL MEASURES OF STRUCTURE, COST, AND SUPPORT

- SRAE funding
- Grant recipient staffing
- Training, technical assistance, and monitoring
- Numbers of providers and youth

# PROVIDER-LEVEL MEASURES OF STRUCTURE, COST, AND SUPPORT

- For each provider, grant recipients will submit data on:
  - Funding
  - Administrative staffing
  - Whether implemented programming for youth during the reporting period
- For providers serving youth during the period, grant recipients will also submit data on:
  - Facilitator staffing and training
  - Implementation challenges and needs for technical assistance





## PROGRAM-LEVEL MEASURES OF STRUCTURE, COST, AND SUPPORT

For each program model each provider implements, grant recipients will submit data on:

- Core curriculum implemented
- Intended program delivery hours
- SRAE topics addressed by the core curriculum
- Supplemental program elements
- Target populations





### MEASURES OF ATTENDANCE, REACH, AND DOSAGE

 Number of youth who attended at least one program session during the reporting period: overall, by grade grouping, and by implementation setting

Program Model

- Number of parents/guardians and other adults who attended at least one program session
- Whether more than 50 percent of youth were in specified highly vulnerable populations
- Number of youth completing at least 75 percent of intended program hours
- Number of program hours delivered for each cohort



#### INFORMATION ON PARTICIPANT SURVEY ADMINISTRATION

For entry survey and, separately, for exit survey:


- Mode(s) of data collection used for participant surveys
- Whether program received an approved waiver letter from Federal Project Officer for any survey items

### MEASURES OF PARTICIPANT CHARACTERISTICS, PROGRAM EXPERIENCES, AND PERCEPTIONS OF PROGRAM EFFECTS

- Entry survey
  - Demographics
  - Behaviors
- Exit survey
  - Demographics
  - Program experiences

#### OPTIONAL DATA RECORDING TOOLS

- For measures of structure, cost, and support for program implementation:
  - Grant recipient-level tool and provider- and program-level tool
- For measures of attendance, reach, and dosage:
  - Sessions version or hours version
- For measures of participant characteristics, program experiences, and perceptions of program effects:
  - Entry survey tool and exit survey tool



#### PREPARING SURVEY DATA FILES FOR UPLOAD

- Grant recipients can choose between:
  - 1. Using the optional Excel data recording tools
  - 2. Creating an extract file from grant recipient's data system containing:
    - Grant recipient, provider, and program name
    - Indicator of survey version: MS, HS, MS Impact (for entry), HS Impact (for entry)
    - Reponses to survey questions
- Use .csv format for larger files (e.g., more than 10,000 respondents)
- Upload one file containing all entry survey data and a separate file
   SRAEPAS containing all exit survey data

#### DATA SUBMISSION VALIDATION PAGE

- Validation page in the Portal helps identify missing data and other issues
- Before finalizing your submission:
  - Confirm all expected data are entered
  - Resolve any data issues flagged by the validation checks



#### **USER ACCOUNTS**

- Existing users will access accounts created during earlier submission periods
- New user accounts:
  - Initial grant-level accounts for new grants awarded in October 2024 will be created on July 1, 2025
  - Grant-level users can create additional accounts, if desired, for:
    - Other grant-level users, including evaluators
    - Provider-level users

- Grant recipients are ultimately responsible for ensuring all data are submitted


